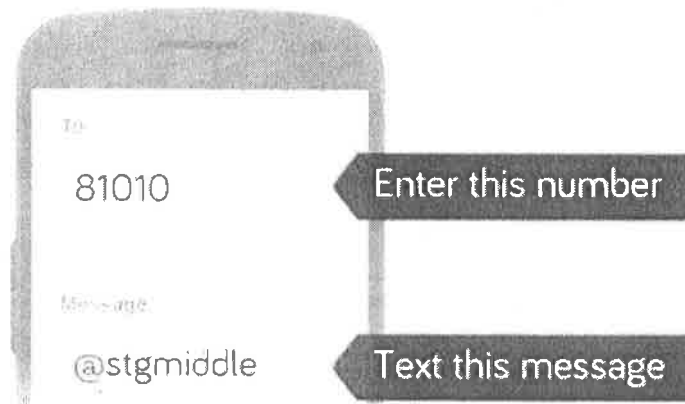

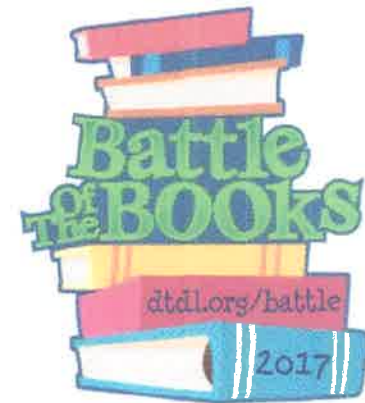

### What is Battle of the Books?

It's a fun trivia competition that tests your book knowledge. Teams of 4-5 participants read the five selected Battle books. In February and March, teams will compete in a series of battles to see which team knows the most about the books.

### Who can participate?

Adults, teens, and kids (4<sup>th</sup> grade and up) are welcome, and teams can be made up of participants of all ages. A team could be a family of four, grandparents and grandchildren, four teen classmates, five book club friends, or other combinations. The booklist includes books appropriate for young readers but will appeal to all ages. Families are encouraged to participate together; even children too young for the competition can be included in the fun by acting as team cheerleaders and reading books on similar topics.

### Team Members

Teams are encouraged to have at least 4 and a maximum of 5 members. It can be helpful for kid teams to have an adult on their team or acting as coach/team leader.

### The Battles

Teams will compete to see who knows the most about the five Battle books. All teams will participate in the preliminary and semi-final battles. After the preliminary round, teams will be assigned a semi-final time. The top teams from each semi-final round will earn a spot in the final battle. Participants are encouraged to invite friends and family to their battles to cheer them on!

### Prizes

All participants will be rewarded. First, second and third place teams will win Barnes & Noble gift cards.

### Locations

DTDL and Grand Ledge Area District Library are partnering again this year. Some programs will be held at DTDL, some at GLADL, and books will be available at both locations. Two libraries, two communities, one great Battle of the Books program!

### The Books

Questions come from all of the books, so the more each team member reads, the better the chances in the competition. All titles are available from DTDL and GLADL in multiple formats.

#### **Book Scavenger by Jennifer Chambliss Bertman**

Emily loves playing Book Scavenger, a game where puzzling clues lead you to hidden books around the country. After moving, she teams up with a new friend, James, to follow the secrets of an odd book, hoping to save her hero, and themselves, from danger.

#### **Chasing Secrets by Gennifer Choldenko**

In 1900, rumors have started that the plague is spreading in San Francisco, and Lizzie, who helps her doctor father make house calls, becomes scared for Jing, her family's beloved cook, when Chinatown is quarantined. Lizzie hopes to solve the medical mystery in her city and keep her family safe.

#### **The Luck Uglies by Paul Durham**

Rye O'Chanter and her two friends delve into the secret lore of their village when mysterious creatures of legend reappear on the night of the Black Moon, leading them to the notorious secret society, the Luck Uglies.

#### **The Seventh Most Important Thing by Shelley Pearsall**

In 1963, 13-year-old Arthur is sentenced to community service helping the neighborhood Junk Man after he throws a brick at the old man's head in a moment of rage, but the junk he collects might be more important than he suspects.

#### **The Water Castle by Megan Frazer Blakemore**

Ephraim is suspicious of Crystal Springs, Maine, when his family moves into an inherited mansion. All the kids seem to be abnormally high-achievers and he begins to uncover dark secrets involving the town, family rivalries, and a generations-long quest to find healing waters.
