


Truly this might be wishful thinking but St. Gerard School Office hopes to reduce our carbon footprint to some extent. Here is the plan:

ST. GERARD SCHOOL HEALTH POLICY

In order to protect your child and all children attending St. Gerard School, please be mindful of the following health guidelines. These policies have attempted to address the most common illnesses. It is not all-inclusive.

SYMPTOM	POLICY
temperature of 100 degrees or above	Child must be picked up immediately. Child may return after 24 hours of normal temperature without medication. (i.e. Children's Tylenol, etc.
untreated eye infection (pink eye)	Child may return after 24 hours with medication.
rashes	Unidentified rashes need a doctor's written confirmation that it is not contagious. If treatment is needed, child may return after 12 hours.
scabies/lice	Child may return after 24 hours of treatment. Classroom parents will be notified.
recurring diarrhea	Child may return after 24 hours without a repeat incident or with doctor's confirmation that the condition is not contagious.
vomiting	Child may return after 24 hours without an incident.
contagious diseases (chicken pox, measles, mumps, roseola)	Child may return after sores have scabbed over. Classroom parents will be notified.
strep throat/tonsillitis	Child may return after 24 hours of treatment with medication.

Physical Education

Welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! My name is Becki Bishop and I will be your student's physical education teacher. I have 22 years of teaching and coaching experience where I have worked primarily with middle school, high school and collegiate level students across the globe in Michigan, China, The Netherlands and now back to Michigan. I am very excited to be working with you and your child this academic year and feel honored to be teaching K-8.

Physical education is an integral part of the educational process in the development of the whole child: spiritually, academically, socially and emotionally. The physical education program at St. Gerard will prepare and encourage students to develop a positive attitude toward participating in physical activity for the pursuit of fitness and wellness.

Student's will be exposed to several different types of physical activities that will provide them with the opportunity to develop knowledge, skill, fitness and attitudes that are crucial to leading a healthy lifestyle. Students will participate in a wide variety of individual sports, team sports and physical fitness activities. Students will learn and develop motor skills through various teaching/learning progressions and demonstrate competence in selected motor skills. Students will learn to apply, assess, achieve and maintain physical fitness as it relates to leading a healthy lifestyle.

My goal is to empower all students to sustain regular, lifelong physical activity as a foundation for a healthy, productive and fulfilling life. I will help students set goals and teach them strategies that will allow them to believe that they can achieve their personal best. I will ensure a safe, positive learning environment that will promote a love of learning, a respect for diversities, responsibility for self and concern for others. I will also set high expectations and hold each student accountable.

Finally, your student will have physical education the same day of the week, each week. I ask for your assistance in making sure that your student has appropriate clothing (see grade level expectations) for that day in order to participate safely in all indoor and outdoor activities.

Physical Education Grade Level Expectations

Teacher: Becki Bishop

All Students K-8:

Please label all physical education clothing with the student's name. This is very helpful when items are left behind.

If there are any health concerns that I need to be aware of, please call, email or send in a note with your child. If your child is not able to participate in physical education class because of illness or injury and will be out of PE class for one period a parent note is acceptable. If your child will be out of PE class for two or more class periods, a Dr's note is required. Please send in a Dr's note with a return to activity date. If they can participate in a modified activity please have that written on the Dr's note as well.

When a student forgets to bring clothes/tennis shoes, they will be expected to walk in a designated area for the duration of class or be assigned a job to keep them engaged. If a pattern occurs, a parent will be contacted.

Grades K-2:

- ★ Students will participate in PE class twice a week with the exception of Kindergartners, who will alternate the second day of PE by marking periods. During PE K-2 students will have the opportunity to work on motor skills and movement patterns, personal and social behaviors, recognize the benefits of physical activity and demonstrate skills to maintain a healthy lifestyle.
- ★ Athletic (PE) shoes are required and will be left at school.
- ★ Girls need a pair of shorts and/or sweatpants (Shorts of appropriate length and NO spandex to abide by school rules) and a sweatshirt/jacket for colder weather.
- \bigstar Boys participate in school pants but sweatshirt/jackets are recommended for colder weather.
- ★ Students will receive their effort and conduct grades for PE. Please see the Specials Grading sheet sent home (also posted on website) for the effort/conduct expectations.
- ★ Label all clothing with the student's name. This is very helpful when items are left behind.
- ★ See note above regarding health concerns and appropriate steps for sending a written note to school with your student.

Grade 3-6:

★ Students will participate in PE class twice a week. During PE, 3-4 grade students will have the opportunity to work on motor skills and movement patterns, personal and social behaviors

- that respect self and others, recognize the benefits of physical activity and demonstrate skills to maintain a healthy lifestyle.
- ★ Athletic (PE) shoes are required and comfortable athletic clothing. Clothes must be school appropriate loose fitting full t-shirt with sleeves NO spandex see handbook for details.
- ★ Students will be using the locker room to change into gym clothes. A cubby will be assigned to each student in the locker room.
- ★ We will be outside often for class, sweatshirts and sweatpants are recommended for colder weather.
- ★ Recommend a different pair of socks, as some of 3-4 grade PE classes are in the mornings.
- ★ Deodorant is suggested roll on only NO aerosol sprays!
- ★ Students will receive their effort and conduct grades for PE. Please see the Specials Grading sheet sent home (also posted on website) for the effort /conduct expectations.

Grade 7-8 / Electives:

- ★ Students will participate in class once a week. During PE, students will have the opportunity to work on motor skills and movement patterns, personal and social behaviors that respect self and others, apply strategies and tactics related to movement and performance, game play, and demonstrate skills to achieve and maintain a health-enhancing level of physical activity and fitness.
- ★ Athletic (PE) shoes are required and comfortable athletic clothing. Clothes must be school appropriate loose fitting full t-shirt with sleeves NO spandex see handbook for details.
- ★ Students will be using the locker room to change into gym clothes. A cubby will be assigned to each student in the locker room.
- ★ We will be outside often for class, sweatshirts and sweatpants are recommended for colder weather.
- ★ Deodorant is suggested roll on only NO aerosol sprays!
- ★ Students will receive a letter grade and an effort and conduct grade. This grade will count towards athletics.

Children's Choir is a team commitment in many ways like a sport. Each member is valuable and it is important that we work together as a team and support each other at events. We will be following an attendance policy very similar to the St. Gerard Athletic Policy. Please read it carefully.

- Students are expected to be at after school rehearsal if in attendance at school.
 If there is an appointment that causes them to miss, Ms. Olivia should be notified by at least the Tuesday before or it will count as an unexcused absence.
- Students are expected to participate in the Sunday masses. It is understood that you may have to miss due to family obligations but Ms. Olivia needs to be notified before the mass occurs. 


